

# CHASS COLLEGE OF HUMANITIES, ARTS, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES SELF-GUIDED TOUR

VISIT THE BUILDINGS, FACILITIES, AND OTHER CAMPUS LANDMARKS ASSOCIATED WITH THE COLLEGE OF HUMANITIES, ARTS, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES.



**1 GETTING STARTED** – Go west (right) from the steps of the Student Services Building toward Hinderaker Hall. Keep to the left along the paved sidewalk and take a left into the plaza of the red-tiled Humanities and Social Sciences Building.

**2 HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES BUILDING** – Home for the CHASS advising offices as well as the departments of History, English, Philosophy, and Foreign Languages, which offers instruction in 14 different languages. Exit the Humanities and Social Sciences plaza the same way you entered and take an immediate right along the walkway beneath the pillars.



**3 SPROUL HALL** – Next on the right is Sproul Hall. Sproul contains the Department of Economics as well as the Graduate School of Education, (recognized as the Nation's Most Distinguished Teacher Education Program). In the basement of Sproul, you'll find our state-of-the-art television studio.



**4 WATKINS HALL** – After leaving Sproul, take a right then an immediate left to Watkins Hall. Watkins is one of the five original campus buildings (1953) and is home to the departments of Anthropology, Sociology, and Political Science, as well as to one of the campus' several computer labs (featuring printers, software and both MAC and PC computers).



**5 OLMSTED HALL** – Take a right on the next walkway and travel the length of Watkins Hall. Directly ahead of you is Olmsted Hall, to the right, the University Theater. Olmsted is the home of the University Honors Program, Statistics, Business Administration, and UC Mexus Program. The University Theater is UCR's main venue for musical and theatrical performances.



**6 PSYCHOLOGY** – Beyond the Olmsted Arches is the Psychology Building – home of one of UCR's most popular majors. The Psychology building houses academic and departmental offices, research laboratories, and open class laboratories. To return to the tour, please retrace your steps back through the Olmsted Arches toward the Rivera Library.



**7 8 CARILLON MALL** – Stroll the length of the walkway beneath the iconic Rivera Arches. Up ahead you'll find the Bell Tower and, beyond that, the new Highlander Union Building (HUB). Continue straight ahead, and just past the HUB, you'll find the UCR Campus Store.



**9 NORTH CAMPUS DRIVE** – Continue ahead to North Campus Drive. Straight ahead you will see UCR's new Materials Science and Engineering Building. Go left. On your right you'll see athletic fields (softball, soccer, and track) and, off in the distance, the Student Recreation Center – the home venues for several Highlander teams ("Take Pride in R'Side!").

**10 ARTS BUILDING** – When you reach Canyon Crest Drive, take a left and the Arts Building will be on your right. The Arts Building is a magnificent, one-of-a-kind facility that has won several awards for its architecture. Our fine arts program has received generous grants from the Gluck Foundation and includes majors in theatre, music, dance, art, art history, and the Music Library.



**11 CHASS INTERDISCIPLINARY BUILDING** – Located directly across from the Arts Building is the CHASS Interdisciplinary Building, which opened its doors in 2007. It houses six departments (Religious Studies, Women's Studies, Media & Cultural Studies, Ethnic Studies, Creative Writing, and Theatre), several interdisciplinary programs, and the UCR media library.



**1 STUDENT SERVICES BUILDING (SSB)** – Continue straight ahead towards Hinderaker and then go left to the Student Services Building – the building where your tour began. The SSB houses the offices of admissions, financial aid, the cashier, the registrar, and campus tours. It also includes the convenient Highlander One-Stop Shop (HOSS).

This completes your CHASS tour. You may want to take a moment to stop in at the HUB to grab a bite to eat. Or feel free to wander around the rest of the campus, take a full campus tour, and learn more fun facts about UCR and its facilities.

## SoBA SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

VISIT THE BUILDINGS, FACILITIES, AND OTHER CAMPUS LANDMARKS ASSOCIATED WITH THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION.

**5 OLMSTED HALL** – In addition to serving as the home for the University Honors Program and Statistics, Olmsted Hall is the home to the Undergraduate Business program for The School of Business Administration (SoBA). SoBA offers the UC's oldest and most comprehensive undergraduate Business Administration major.

SoBA emphasizes growing strengths in the areas of marketing, supply chain management, accounting, and finance. The undergraduate business major is intended for students who seek a professional education in the functional field of private sector management.

Up the hill and to the right of the Psychology Building, you can see the historic Anderson Hall — home of the A. Gary Anderson Graduate School of Management (AGSM). AGSM is one of the nation's fastest growing graduate business schools, and offers specialized programs such as the Master of Professional Accountancy (MPAc), the Fully Employed Master of Business Administration (FEMBA), and our Interdepartmental Graduate Program in Management (IGPM), in addition to the traditional MBA.
