FUN FACTS AND LITTLE KNOWN TRIVIA ABOUT UC RIVERSIDE!

H1 ARTS BUILDING – Architect Frank Israel's design has been called “an interpretive formal synthesis of desert terrain and the disjointed urbanism that has grown up there.” Um, we just think it looks really cool.



H2 ATHLETIC FIELDS – Who says UCR doesn't have football? We just call it soccer... and we're darn good at it. Two of our men's players have been drafted by the Major League Soccer (MLS), while our women's team has been to the NCAA Tournament.



H3 BOURNS HALL – Fifty miles from the shore, yet we have our own coral reef! The Biomimetic and Nanostructured Materials Laboratory coral reef in Bourns Hall is a 500 gallon seawater system that offers homes for both coldwater and tropical species, including marine snails and sea urchins.



H4 VEITCH STUDENT CENTER – For your health. For your future. For your peace of mind. The Veitch Student Center contains the Campus Health Center, the Career Center, and the Counseling Center.



H5 STUDENT HOUSING – Your home away from home. With 10 unique communities on campus – residence halls, apartments, themed halls, family housing – we've got the perfect match for every student.



H6 SEE THE “C”! – You can see the “C” from several on-campus locations, but we prefer the view from the Orbach Science Library lawn. The “C” is one of the largest concrete letters in the world and a popular hiking destination.



H7 GEOLOGY BUILDING – There are a lot of cool displays in the hallways of the Geology Building. But the highlight is the painstakingly reconstructed mastodon. Although we were pretty impressed by the skull of the saber-toothed cat.



H8 ANDERSON HALL – Now the home of the highly ranked A. Gary Anderson School of Management, this 1917 building was originally the home of the California Citrus Experiment Station – the groundbreaking research facility that contributed greatly to California's agricultural industry.



H9 ENTOMOLOGY DEPARTMENT INSECT DISPLAYS – The Entomology Building, has an amazing display of rare and beautiful insects from all over the world... some still alive! Come say hi. After all, it's their world, we're just living in it.



H10 BOTANIC GARDENS – “Naked Ladies at UCR!” Among the thousands of plant and wildlife species you'll find in UCR's beautiful Botanic Gardens, is the *Amaryllis belladonna* – a pretty lily native to South Africa and more commonly known as the naked lady.



H11 THE CARILLON – The Carillon Bell Tower in the very center of the campus contains 48 bells – ranging in size from 28 pounds to 5,091 pounds. The tower itself stands 161 feet tall, and, is it just us, or does the Bell Tower look like the world's tallest CD rack?



H12 GEEKY DESTINATION! – Zap! Pow! The Eaton Collection (at Rivera Library) is the world's largest catalogued collection of science fiction, fantasy, horror and utopian literature. *Wired Magazine* called the collection the world's #2 Geeky Destination!



H13 HIGHLANDER UNION BUILDING (HUB) – The Highlander Union Building (Or the “HUB”), is UCR's central gathering place. The perfect place for you and your friends to meet, eat, relax and study. Your group or organization can also hold meetings or host events here.



H14 THE CAMPUS STORE – The place to go for books, textbooks, computer supplies, as well as cool UCR gear and Tartanwear. Get your gear and go stark raving plaid!



H15 COSTO HALL – The place where groups that bring students together come together. Costo Hall is home to many of UCR's student service organizations including several Cultural Student Programs, the Women's Resource Center, and the LGBT Resource Center.



H16 STUDENT SERVICES BUILDING – The Student Services Building features the Highlander One-Stop Shop (HOSS) for student services including admissions, financial aid, the cashier, the registrar, and campus tours.



H17 THE BARN – Originally an actual working barn, The Barn is now an intimate eatery and gathering place. Performers who have graced the stage include Bob Dylan (in 1964), No Doubt, Rage Against the Machine, and Foster the People!


